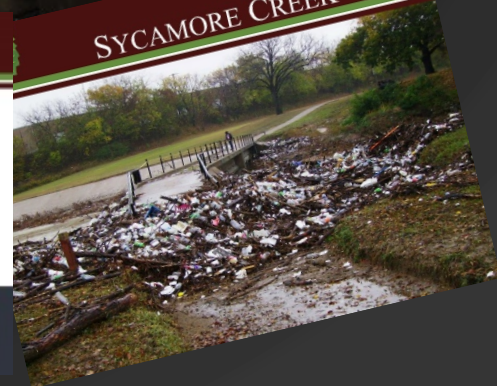

MARK POTOK: "THE STATE OF HATE IN AMERICA"

Mark Potok of the Southern Poverty Law Center is one of the country's leading experts on the world of extremism and serves as the editor-in-chief of SPLC's award-winning, quarterly journal, the Intelligence Report and it's investigative reports. Potok has appeared on numerous television news programs and is quoted regularly by journalists and scholars in the United States and abroad. In addition, he has testified before the U.S. Senate and the United Nations High Commission on Human Rights.



Before joining the SPLC staff in 1997, Mark spent 20 years as an award winning journalist at major newspapers, including USA Today, The Dallas Times Herald and The Miami Herald. While at USA today he covered the 1993 Waco siege, the rise of militias, the 1995 Oklahoma City bombing and the trial of Timothy McVeigh.

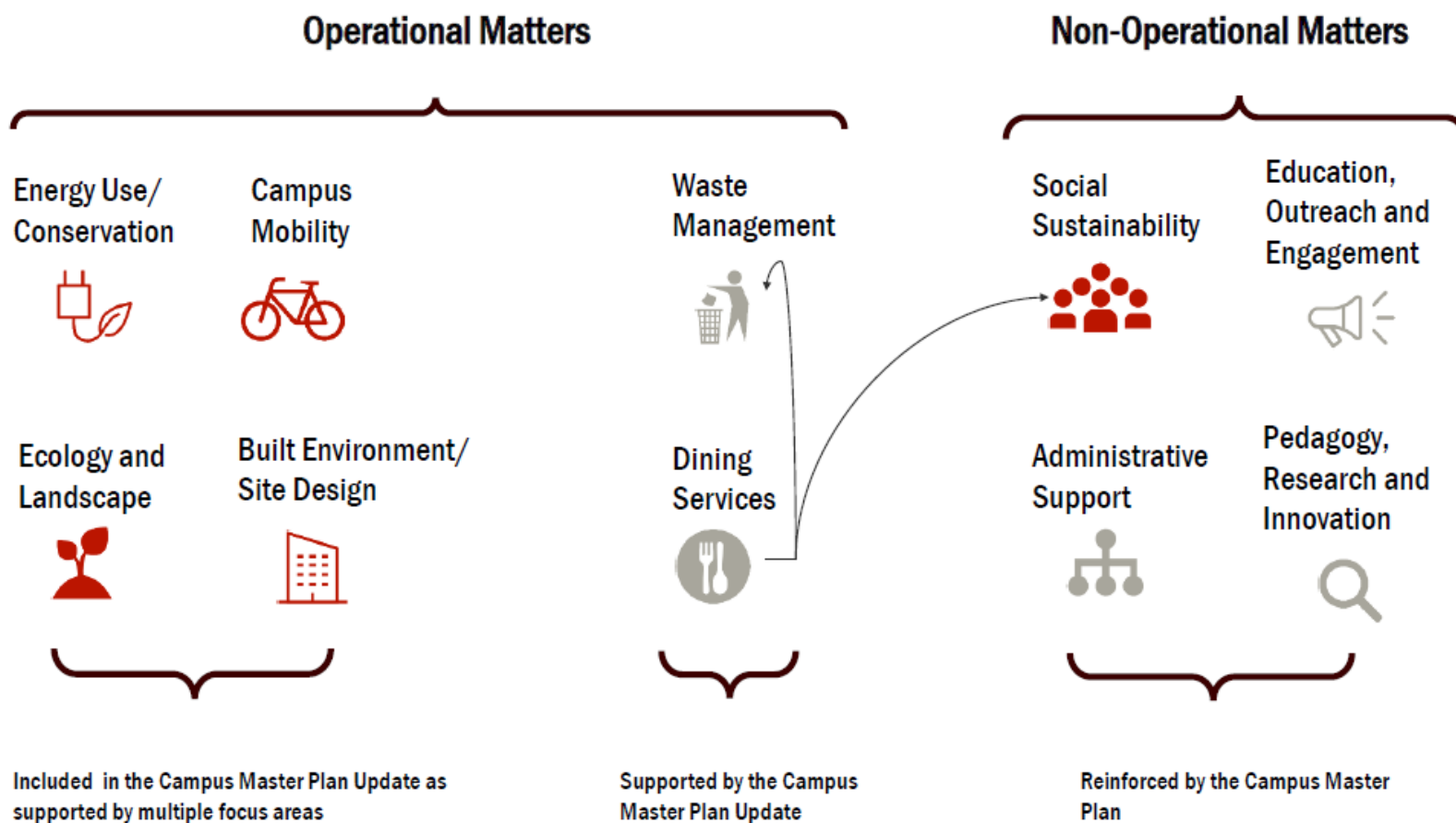

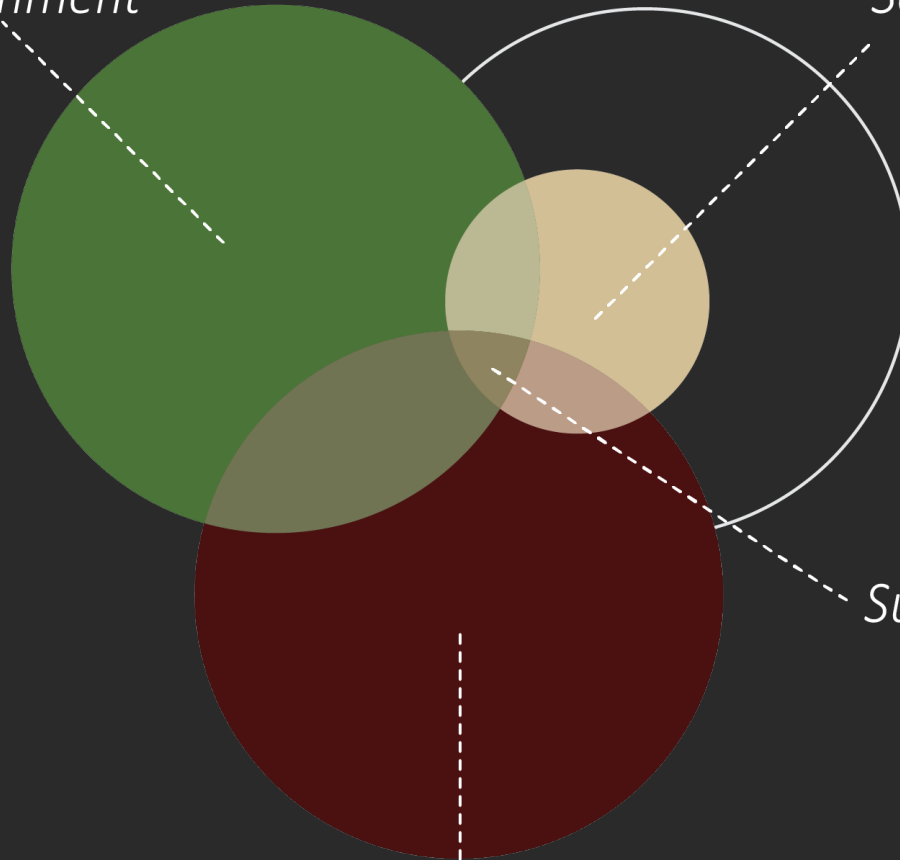

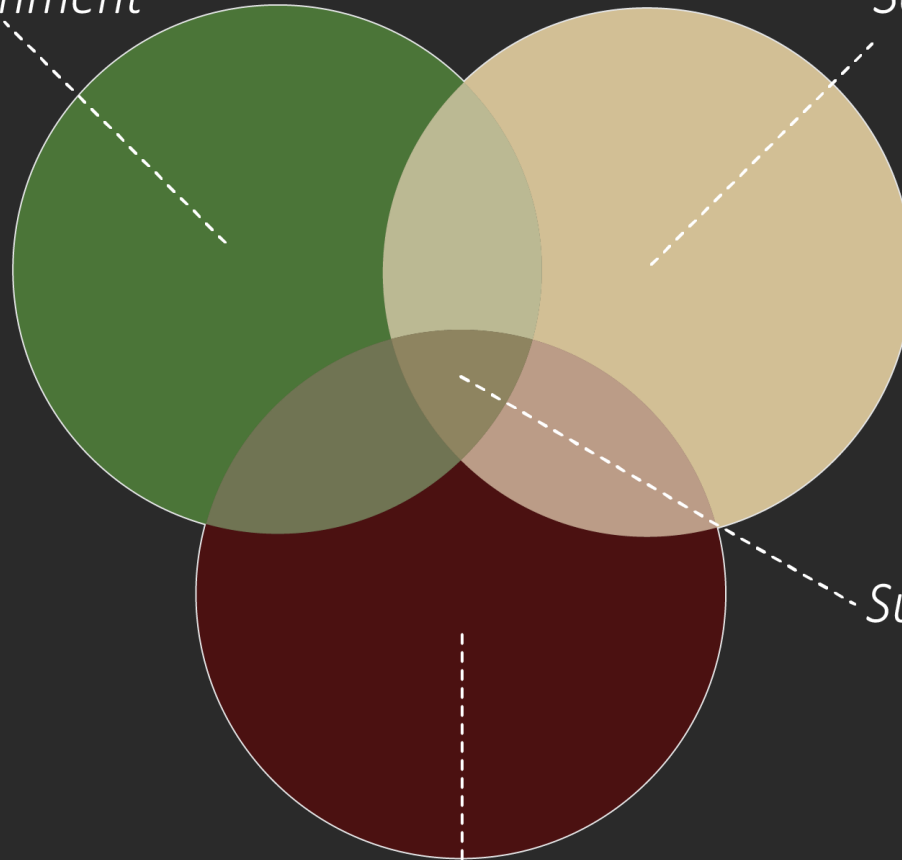
